WASTE MANAGEMENT POLICY

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Vision

The college envisions to keep its sprawling campus completely green. It adheres to the sustainable preservation and protection of environment where wastes are reduced, re-used, and recycled systematically.

Objectives

- > To create consciousness among faculty and students about the adverse impact of waste materials on both health and environment.
- ➤ To promote a superior quality of life and environment, student-staff participation is ensured in the waste management process.
- ➤ To make sure the systematic disposal of any materials found futile.
- To ensure viable options for scientific waste management.
- > To assure the safety of cleaning staff by providing the necessary gloves and disinfectants.

Policy

- > Students are advised not to waste food.
- ➤ Waste bins are placed at every nook and corner of the campus to facilitate easier collection of waste, mainly at the point of waste generation itself.
- Colour coded separate containers for waste collection: food waste and plastic waste are kept.
- ➤ The degradable solid waste is used as manure for providing nourishment to the Miyawaki forest developed in the campus for creating carbon sinks.
- ➤ The college follows a zero-food waste policy, and it is implemented through the rearing of three emus. The consumption of food waste by the emus keeps the campus clean.

- ➤ The college has installed a sanitary napkin vending machine and incinerator that help in the safe, efficient, and eco-friendly disposal of the used napkins.
- > Non- hazardous liquid waste is used for the farming purposed within the campus.
