World Environment Day

On 5 June 2018, the NSS volunteers organised the Tree Plantation Programme under the guidance of the Programme Officer. Over 50 saplings were planted and each student volunteer was assigned one sapling to nourish and care for. The NSS Unit decided to proceed further with the same inspiration through a Plastic Collection Drive. The volunteers gathered across the areas adjoining the college campus to collect all forms of plastic waste like discarded plastic bags, wrappers, bottles and so on. They ensured the maintenance of a plastic free campus. Around 100 saplings were divided among the students, teaching faculty and non-teaching staff members as each one of them pledged to adopt a sapling and take care of its growth in their home environments. Thus the programme aims at not only planting trees among college campus, but also it shares the habit of planting of tree saplings at the homes of the teaching, non-teaching staffs and families of students and they are the beneficiaries participated in the programme.



BLOOD DONATION CAMP

On 8 June 2018 an awareness class related to blood donation was organised at the Seminar Hall of Christ Nagar College in association with the All Kerala Blood Donors' Association. Mr. Biju, the President of the Blood Donors' Association handled an engaging session on the importance of blood donation, and the various aspects of the process regarding who can donate and so on. Subsequent to the blood donation awareness class, a Blood Donation Camp was heldon 13 June 2018. Over 100 students participated in the programme and it was a successful endeavor. The donors from the students donate their blood to the RCC, Trivandum. As they are previously aware about the blood donation, most of the students were participated in the blood donation camp without so many confusions and can successfully conducted the camp.

Flood Relief 2018-19

On 16/08/2018 NSS volunteers of Christ Nagar College made remarkable intervention in the form of Flood Relief Programme when the whole state was under the threat of a massive flood. The volunteers, with the help of the staff of Christ Nagar College, went to the houses of our students and collected whatever materials they could provide. The cooperation of the students, parents and staff to this noble venture was heartwarming. After the collection drive the volunteers sorted these materials into different categories and packed them very carefully and distributed to the needy at Punalur, part of which was later distributed at the affected areas of Ranni too. The materials included all household items, dress and food materials. The main aim of the programme is to help the flood affected people in Punalur, Ranni and also give assistance to our own students and their families.

On 30th August 2018, the NSS unit actively joined the efforts of the College to participate in the relief mechanism after the 2018 floods that wreaked havoc all over Kerala. All the students of Christ Nagar College collectively participated in the preparation of manuscript copies of notes named (Sneha Pralayamezhuth) to be supplied to the students who had lost their studymaterials in the floods. We could prepare almost 1200 completed notebooks for different classes from V to XII. The main objective of the programme is to help the students who lost their notebooks in the natural calamity the flood.







Computer Literacy Programme

The NSS unit of Christ Nagar College and one of its most cherishable accomplishments till date was the computer literacy programme organised on 11th September 2018. The mission was to equip the adults above 35 years of age in basic computer knowledge. On 11th and 12th September 2018, the NSS volunteers actively took part in collecting data from the adjoining areas comprising of Maranalloor panchayat. The most challenging aspect faced by the NSS volunteers was to identify the people above the age of thirty five who lacked basic computer skills from among a diverse range of respondents and also effectively convince them to take part in the programme. The NSS volunteers created awareness among the respondents regarding the importance of being equipped in technology to handle daily tasks like the payment of bills, managing Skype calls, online cash transactions and so on. The registration process for the programme began on the 6^{th} September 2018 and forty seven people registered for the course. The programme was officially inaugurated on 10th September 2018, by Smt. Kumari Maya P.S, the then President of the Village Panchayat, in a function which was graced with the presence of the Vice President and the college management. The classes which were conducted by the students, officially kick started on 11th September 2018 and lasted till 15th September 2018. A final exam was conducted on 15th September 2018. The positive results of the exam reflected that the Computer Literacy programme was indeed a successful endeavor
